## EVENTS AT HOME AND ABROAD IN THE SUMMER OF 2022

The summer is traditionally the season of music festivals presenting live music – including contemporary works – in many larger and smaller cities and townships across the Czech Republic. You can read about the NODO opera biennial in Boris Klepal's article in this issue of CMQ. As far as premieres at other festivals are concerned, Litomyšl saw the first performance of Emil Viklický's jazz melodrama and a new cantata by Jiří Gemrot, Broumov hosted Kryštof Marek's concerto for harp and orchestra, Zlín welcomed Tomáš Ille's symphonic melodrama, and Opava a new piece of sacred music by Martin Smolka. You will find information about other new chamber, choral, and solo pieces in the overview below. Works by Czech composers were also premiered abroad – worth mentioning are Jakub Rataj's *Air (give the people some)*, performed in the German city of Kassel, or Miroslav Srnka's *Standstill* for harpsichord and orchestra, which was first played in Cologne.

The beginning of the new concert season in Prague also provided concert-goers with several interesting opportunities. The highly theme of sexual abuse and trauma, highly resonant in society at the moment, was sensitively adapted in Slavomír Hořínka's opera *Tak tiše až* (*So Silent Till*), presented by the Berg Orchestra and the dance theatre group Spitfire Company. The entire plot is narrated through the thoughts and feelings of the now-grown-up survivor, whose part was performed by mezzo-soprano Markéta Cukrová. Her younger self was played by the sixteen-year-old Sarah Alon. The opera, which was a success with both critics and audiences, will be repeated several times in October.
